

Electric Vehicle Charging Point Supply and Installation

THE OFFICE FOR LOW EMISSION VEHICLES (OLEV) THE EV HOME CHARGE SCHEME (EVHS) BASICS

The EVHS grant scheme can finance up to 75% of the cost of installing one EV charging point up to £500 per household/eligible vehicle.

We carry out a site survey before the application. This includes checking with the electricity supplier that the electrical capacity of the site can support the socket applied for.

The Applicant must provide evidence of keepership, lease for at least 6 months, be named as the primary user of an eligible electrical vehicle, which can be new or second hand, or have an electric vehicle on order. The date of installation must be not more than 4 months ahead of the date of delivery or start date of vehicle use.

Eligibility includes individuals assigned as the primary user of a company car for at least 6 months or who have leased a vehicle as part of a salary sacrifice scheme. A second grant cannot be claimed if the named individual changes within the 6 months. You can claim for a second charging point if you have 2 (maximum) eligible vehicles. The Applicant must have dedicated private off-street parking accessible at all times and must either own the property or have consent from the landlord for the installations.

Each grant claim must be accompanied by a form that includes a customer declaration of eligibility and in the case of a company car a declaration on company headed paper signed by the responsible manager or Director.

You can not claim the VAT back under EVHS. Three-pin charging points are not eligible for the grant.

Motor Trade: The original Applicant must have retained the use of the vehicle for a minimum of 6 months for the next owner to be eligible for a new grant claim using the same vehicle.



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
